Personal Safety for Community-Based Employees

Safety While Walking

- 1. Wear proper clothing for the work that is being done.
- 2. Carry your personal items (purse, camera, and other items) in a proper manner.
- 3. Always be aware of passing cars and the people around you.
- 4. When walking, be aware of possible escape routes.



Preparations to be Addressed Before a Service Visit:

- 1. Learn as much as possible about your client, customer, or consumer.
- 2. Prior to the visit, learn about the neighborhood, parking, people who will be at the site or in the site building, and any other relevant information.
- 3. Provide your employer with your visit itinerary.
- 4. Plan a route to be followed prior to the visit.
- 5. Bring a cell phone.

Safety While Driving

- 1. Check condition of the vehicle.
- 2. Check the inside of vehicle before entering and adjust seat and mirrors if necessary.
- 3. Follow the route that has been planned.
- 4. Be aware of people around you while driving.
- 5. At the worksite, keep your vehicle locked.
- 6. Keep all valuables out of sight.

Parking Lot Safety

- 1. Park in a well-lit area and as close to the building as possible.
- 2. Always be aware of people around building and vehicle
- 3. Never approach your vehicle if you sense danger.
- 4. Security can assist if necessary.
- 5. Always check under, around and inside of vehicle prior to entering.
